World Vision Day - October 8, 2019

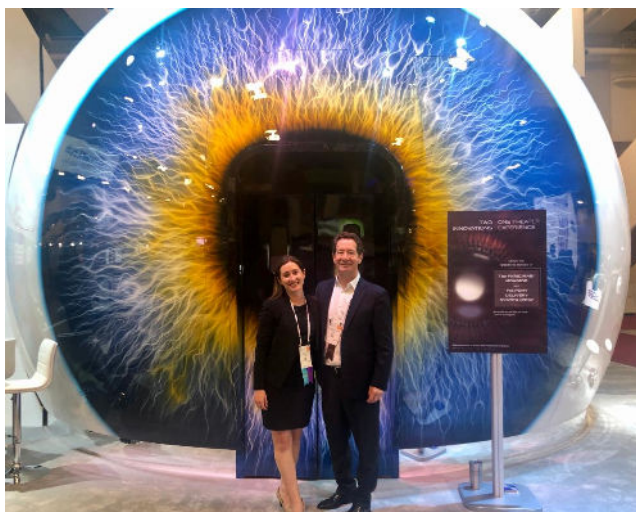
Dr. Fatimah Gilani was interviewed on CP24 on World Vision Day, answering questions about Canadian Health Care and innovations in cataract surgery.

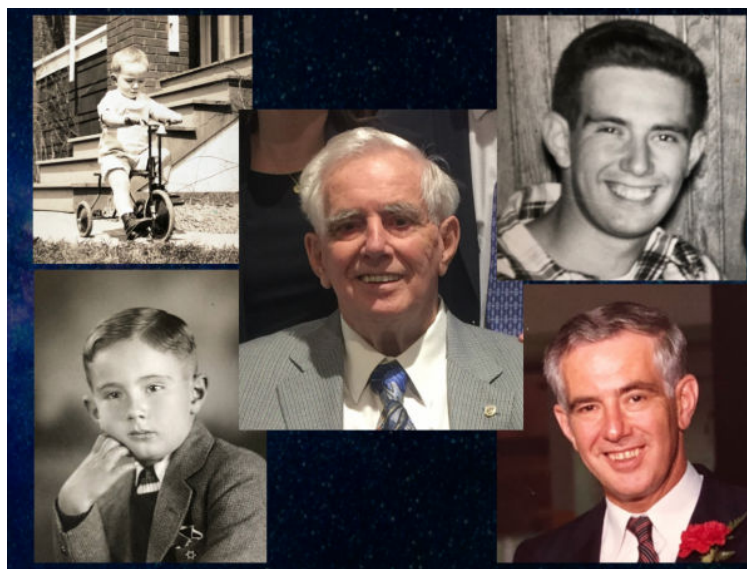

90th Birthday of Dr Harold Stein - Celebration Event May 2019

Congratulations to Dr. Harold Stein on his 90th birthday! He continues to be active in ophthalmology - just completing the *11th edition* of his best-selling book, **The Ophthalmic Assistant**.

The Canadian Ophthalmology Society (COS) established the **Stein Innovators Lecture**, delivered each year by an international invited speaker at the annual meeting. This is the first named lecture of the COS in its over 80 year history.



COS Article on Bochner Eye Institute Research: False Ectasia



Dr. Raymond Stein and Dr. Ghani Salim, MD of the Bochner Eye Institute analyzed 1000 consecutive records of patients with a presumed diagnosis of keratoconus, pellucid marginal degeneration, and ectasia after laser vision correction between January 1, 2010 and November 1, 2016.

The study concluded that ectasia was misdiagnosed in 2 percent of cases (20 in 1000), reinforcing the clinical diligence required to differentiate from true

keratoconus, pellucid marginal degeneration, and ectasia after laser vision correction. There is usually no benefit to topography-guided PRK or intrastromal corneal rings in these cases.
